Cross-examined by MR DALLAS
- B** Q I just want to ask you a very few questions about what [Person A1] told you about the incident when Fahim (inaudible).
- JUDGE DURHAM HALL: Are you going to make it better, Mr Dallas? I'm concerned about this. She's given very clear evidence about Fahim. It's up to you, okay.
- C** MR DALLAS: Okay. I do have one question arising from that. So, to the best of your recollection is correct, she told you that she'd been bent over, Fahim had left the room, then Kieran had come in and he'd had sex with her without her realising.
- A Yes.
- D** Q You were asked some questions a few moments ago about when she told you that and you said you couldn't remember.
